Description

Fulcrum Diversified Absolute Return aims to achieve long-term absolute returns in all market conditions over rolling five-year periods, with lower volatility than equity markets and in excess of inflation. Investments are sought with a focus on liquidity and are multi-asset in nature; with exposure across equity, fixed income, currency and commodity markets globally.

²Standalone risk by asset class - is calculated by the current category weight in the portfolio multiplied by the standard deviation of portfolio holdings in that category. All data used are as of 11/30/18. Standalone risk is measured for each category independently of other categories and does not take into account their potential offsetting effect. Therefore, the sum of standalone risk for all categories will exceed the risk of the entire portfolio. Standalone risk indicates to the investor the risk of holding a category by itself.

³Volatility – is comprised of option contract positions in the portfolio with various underlying asset classes, to express views on the realized volatility of a particular asset class.

⁴Diversifying Strategies – are comprised of systematically implemented exposure using futures to various asset classes which are included for diversification purposes and could include equities, fixed income, currencies and commodities.

⁵Cross Asset – are comprised of positions across two asset classes, to express a view on the relative performance between those two asset classes, which could include equities, fixed income, currencies and commodities. As of November 30, 2018, this category is comprised of the following positions: US Equities vs Japanese Yen.

⁶Portfolio Realized Risk – as measured by daily realized volatility of the portfolio from 7/31/15 to 11/30/18.
